One of our major recommendations was that indigenous Irish enterprises deserved at least as much attention as foreign multinationals looking to set up subsidiaries in the Emerald Isle.

It was delightful, therefore, to see how much progress has been made in encouraging innovative new companies, (in spite of Ireland's economic setbacks) when I spoke at a program coordinated by the Irish Management Institute and Enterprise Ireland in support of indigenous Irish companies working on innovationfueled growth programs.
